Use your catechism to help answer the following questions.

1. When is praying difficult for you? When is praying a great comfort and joy?

2. In Christ, God speaks His Yes! to all of His promises (2 Corinthians 1:20). What assurance of God's love and care does Christ's sacrifice give you?

3. Make a list of prayer requests that you have made to your great and powerful God. Why did you pray to Him? How did God answer your prayer?

4. Why do we conclude the Lord's Prayer with words of praise?

5. How do we respond to the gracious answers our God gives us when we pray?



### **CHRISTIAN DOCTRINE**

#### Excerpts from the Large Catechism

The efficacy of prayer consists in our learning to say "Amen" to it – that is, not ot doubt that our prayer is surely heard and will be granted. This word is nothing else than an unquestioning affirmation of faith on the part of one who does not pray, as a matter of chance by knows that God does not lie since he has promised to grant his requests. Where such faith is wanting, there can be no true prayer (436:119-120).

It is therefore a pernicious delusion when people pray in such a way that they dare not wholeheartedly add "yes" and conclude with certainty that God hears their prayer but remain in doubt, saying, "Why should I be so bold as to boast that God hears my prayer? I am only a poor sinner," etc. That means that they have their eye not on God's promise but on their own works and worthiness, so that they despise God and accuse him of lying. Therefore they receive nothing, as St. James says, "If anyone prays, let him ask in faith, without doubting, for he who doubts is like a wave of the sea that is driven and tossed by the wind. For that person must not suppose that he will receive anything from God." Behold, such is the importance that God attaches to our being certain that we do not pray in vain and that we must not in any way despise our prayers (436:121-124).
