CATECHISM CONNECTION

Go over Questions 24-34 (pg 61-67) in the Small Catechism and discuss.

Open up your catechism to help you answer the following questions.

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1.	What is God's name? When do we sin against God's name?
2.	Think about all the swearing in movies, TV, music, books, and magazines. Is there something we can do about it? Are you ever afraid that when you hear so much swearing, you might start swearing?

6.	When we remember Gods' goodness to us, what might Christians do in response?

CHRISTIAN DOCTRINE

You have a name and so does God. How would you feel if your name was used as a curse word? You would not like it, neither does God. Not only that, but our names say something about who, and whose we are. Names have a power in and of themselves.

When you were baptized, God took you into his special family of faith and gave you His name. Because God is holy, He desires us to use his name to talk with others about His will for our lives and about His goodness to us.

Excerpt from the Large Catechism

As the First Commandment has inwardly instructed the heart and taught faith, so this commandment lead us outward and directs the lips and tongue into the right relation to God. (371:50)

God at the same time gives us to understand that we are to sue his namely properly, for it also been revealed and given to us precisely for our use and benefit. Since we are forbidden here to use the holy name in support of falsehood or wickedness, it follows; conversely, that we are commanded to use in the service of truth and all that is good – for example, when we swear properly where it is necessary and required (373:63-64)


